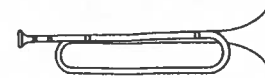

## The Pilgrim's Thanksgiving

Thanksgiving is the benediction of the year. It stands at the end of fall and the beginning of winter; near the end of one year and the beginning of another; with one hand raised in gracious farewell and another beckoning in adventure.

It is truly an American holiday, a festival for all the citizenry of our nation. When after the ingathering of the first harvest in a new world, Governor Bradford sent four men out to shoot wild fowl that the infant Pilgrim colony "might after a more special manner rejoice together," he little dreamed to what that pious act would grow.

We remember the story of the Pilgrims — how the Puritans wanted to purify the established church; how the king said he would make them conform or harry them out of England; how in 1608 a little band from Scrooby in England went to Amsterdam in Holland for religious freedom; how the following year they went to Leyden, where they were for ten years.

Yet not settled, on the sixth of September in 1620, they set out from Plymouth, England, and about three months later, they cast anchor off the coast of Cape Cod on November 21. Then on the 20th of December, they chose Plymouth for their place, this hardy band of 102 Pilgrims.

We have read of the first winter, when nearly half of them perished. Came spring, and the Indians taught them to fertilize corn with the shad and the herring. Their twenty acres of Indian corn did well; their barley, fair; but their peas were a failure. Then when the harvest was gathered, Governor Bradford instituted a feast of thanksgiving.

The fowlers brought home wild turkey, and there were fish, clams and oysters. Then came the Indian chieftain with his ninety picked men. There was feasting for three days. Then, some of the braves went out into the woods and brought home five deer. This was the start of the Thanksgiving tradition in America.


Thanksgiving should be a day of hope. Thus it was in the beginning in the Pilgrim colony, and this it has been across the pulsing years of our nation's history, through peace and plenty, through depression and disaster, through war and rebellion.

With the apostle Paul, we as a nation have been strengthened as in 'prayer and supplication With Thanksgiving, we have let our requests be made known unto God.'
